Cost Savings for Neighbourhood Watch self adhesive signs.



Our recent campaign "Refresh NW Street signs" resulted in a number of enquiries regarding the self adhesive signs and how to order them.

Whilst relatively low cost (compared to aluminium signs), members are faced with paying postage and small order charges for any orders placed. The supplier cost for two signs, inclusive of VAT, postage and small order charge is £17.70

In light of this, the Executive Committee have purchased 50 self adhesive signs, to offset the small order and high postal charges.

We are therefore happy to offer on a first come basis, the white background, black text and yellow logo self adhesive signs (as shown in the picture) - at a cost of £3.50 per sign and a single £3 postage charge.




There have been more reports of doorstep callers operating in Suffolk. Please warn friends, family and neighbours not to deal with any trader cold calling at their property.

Fraudsters send fake Virgin Media emails threatening “automatic disconnection”




Action Fraud has received over 100 reports about fake emails that purport to be from Virgin Media. The emails threaten the recipient with “automatic disconnection” due to “invalid billing information”. The links in the emails lead to genuine-looking phishing websites that are designed to steal your Virgin Media account login details.

Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails, and never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details.
