Derrick and I have recently registered as members of Neighbourhood Watch, which includes receiving local crime and crime prevention alerts from the 'Suffolk Connected' police messaging system. Joining Neighbourhood Watch is free.

Our Neighbourhood Watch Scheme is now registered with the Suffolk Neighbourhood Watch Association and is known as Humber Doucy Lane South. Membership of this is coordinated by Tony Spall (07894 950231), who has been particularly helpful.

Vehicle crime:

It is vitally important that you check your vehicle is locked and that all items are removed. Cars and vans are continuing to be damaged and thieves will steal even loose change. Phones, laptops, wallets and tools continue to be stolen.

Cyber crime and Fraud:

Report Fraud is the new service that has now replaced Action Fraud.

You should report cyber crime and fraud from now on to- reportfraud.police.uk.

Crime figures:

The crime figures released by the Office of National Statistics (ONS) show Suffolk remains in the top three counties in England and Wales where people are least likely to be victims of crime. Latest figures show that Suffolk Police has the third lowest recorded crime figures in the country for the fifth consecutive quarter.

Comparing the 12 months ending June 2025 with the previous 12 month period (ending June 2024), crime in Suffolk has decreased by 4.8%.

Humber Doucy Lane South:

We are still very concerned about the amount and speed of traffic in HD Lane and also about the inconsiderate parking at the Playford Road end, which means pedestrians have to walk in the middle of the road where vehicles are turning into the Lane.

Polite notices are being attached to windscreens when we see a parking problem.
